

St. Peter Orthodox Church Madison, MS

St. Peter Orthodox Church is located in Madison, Mississippi. The parish itself began as a small Bible study in the 1970's led by V. Rev. Fr. John Henderson, now retired, and many others who are still very active members of the parish. Eventually the parish was received into the Antiochian Archdiocese, along with many others, as part of the Evangelical Orthodox Church in 1987.

Throughout the years, St. Peter's has seen slow but fruitful growth as we have strived to serve the community around us in the Jackson, Mississippi area. The parish maintains an extensive schedule of services that consists of Daily Vespers on Wednesdays, the Lord's Day cycle of Great Vespers, Orthros and Divine Liturgy, along with Festal Orthros and Divine Liturgy for the Twelve Great Feasts, as well as an extensive schedule of services for Great Lent and Holy Week.

The Antiochian women are active in monthly lunches with each other, praying the Akathist to the Nurturer of Children on a regular basis, as well as book groups and other activities in service to the parish and community. The Antiochian men also meet once a month for lunch and fellowship together.

Through these activities, worshipping together in the divine services, and love for one another, St. Peter's continues to grow, by the grace of God, into a parish family that supports each other and continues to reach out to our community at large.

The Antiochian Women of the Diocese of Miami and the Southeast gathered on Saturday, April 9th for our first Hub & Spoke Lenten Retreat. Using the amazing technology of Zoom and the gracious hospitality of the ladies of our parishes, we were able to gather for fellowship locally and at the diocese level. This format allowed our ladies to get together in parish halls and homes around the diocese and see other groups of ladies via Zoom.

Bishop Nicholas and Sh. Shell Keim spent the morning at All Saints Orthodox Church in Raleigh, NC with the ladies of that parish as well as the ladies of St. Raphael Orthodox Mission in Fuquay-Varina, NC. Our theme for the retreat was "Your Current Status is Salvific" and we explored the lives of such saints as St. Mary of Egypt and St. Ignatius of Antioch. We compared the lives of these saints to those of St. Thekla and the Prophet Daniel. Sayenda Nicholas shared with the ladies the wisdom that those saints show us: growth comes from struggle. Comparing these saint's lives, we were able to see that whether you remain in the desert, like St. Mary, or at the mouths of lions, like St. Ignatius, your salvation is found in each of these situations if you prepare for the time of suffering by focusing on





your spiritual walk consistently. Our ladies were encouraged to spend five minutes each day in silence. For our busy women this will be a challenge, but by preparing our hearts we will be better able to endure the struggles that inevitably lie ahead.

We were blessed to have 152 ladies representing our many parish groups around the diocese. Each parish was spotlighted on Zoom so they could be recognized and greet Sayenda and the other women of DOMSE. Everyone had their own way of making the retreat their own. Some of our ladies prepared a song to sing! Some groups met in cozy homes and others gathered at their local parish. Tables were

CYBER SPRING LENTEN RETREAT UPDATE

Teen SOYO

On Saturday, April 2nd, DOMSE Teen SOYO met for its fourth annual Cyber Spring Retreat, presided by his Grace, Bishop NICHOLAS. The event was well attended by many teens throughout the diocese; some attended individually while others attended with their parishes.

The morning began with several icebreakers and activities, including an Orthodox parody of the popular game "What do you Meme?" created by DOMSE SOYO President James Elliott, and St. John SOYO Advisor Ted Werthmuller. The participating teens enjoyed the activity.

After icebreakers, a presentation was given by Fr. Gabriel Tannous on the importance of a daily rule of prayer and how one can build up a prayer rule. Fr. Gabriel emphasized that it is important to give to God at least several moments of our day to grow closer to Him. One of the main points Fr. Gabriel made is that the church provides a daily cycle of services that can be used to help us find a good rule of prayer. For example, if we attend liturgy on Sunday, we have already given two hours of our week back to Christ. If we attend orthros and liturgy, then we give God three hours of our week. If we go to vespers on Saturday night and orthros and liturgy on Sunday morning, four hours of our week is given to God. If this routine is followed with morning and evening prayers during the week, a natural and healthy prayer rule will develop.

Furthermore, Fr. Gabriel touched on the concept of keeping a rule that is healthy, not too short, or not too long. With our busy day to day schedules, sometimes it is hard to find time to concentrate on a long prayer rule. To combat this issue, Father suggested that each person ought to adjust the length of prayer to one that is the most helpful for them.

After Fr. Gabriel's presentation, His Grace reminded those present that we should only pray for what we need and not simply for what we want. He stated that if God does not answer our prayer at that moment, it is because He knows best what is needed for us and when we need it.
