CHRIST IS RISEN! TRULY HE IS RISEN!



Having labored patiently, with the help of God, through the Triodion, Great and Holy Lent, and Holy Week, we reaped the rewards during the Pascal services on Sunday morning. Laboring entailed orienting ourselves towards Christ and turning away from our society that professes and entices us to live a life of pleasures, ease, procrastination, and abundance. In his customary sermon, St. John Chrysostom delivered the good news of exhilaration, "Let us all enter into the joy of the Lord for the Lord gives rest to him who comes at the eleventh hour, as well as to him who toiled from the first. To this one He gives, and upon another He bestows. He accepts the work as he greets the endeavor. The deed He honors and the intention He commends."

Our Lord is munificent and overly supportive! He wants us to succeed in gaining His favor and return to the fold. Our intentions and efforts, no matter how minuscule they be, are crucial in attracting His disproportionately copious generosity and kindness! Nevertheless, His excessive rewards should promote in our psyche increased attempts to do better on our side. One way to do that is what St. Ephraim the Syrian suggests, "Brethren we are spiritual merchants, similar to those merchants who take care of material goods. Everyday, the merchant counts his profit and loss, and if he finds loss, he will work on fixing it. Similarly, my beloved ones, you should be careful every day, morning, and evening, watching over your commerce. In the evening, test your heart and ask yourself: did I anger God in any way, or did I say vain words, or was negligent? Did I anger my brother or judge anyone? Was my mouth chanting, and my mind wandering away in earthly cares? Did I face a carnal temptation and accept it with gladness? If you fail the test, think how to restore yourself. Sigh and weep in order not to fall again." Our diligence on a daily basis, as St Ephraim proclaims, is the key to our success in achieving further goals and reconciling ourselves to God on a continual basis.

In other news, the PLC hosted by St. Stephen Church, Hiram, GA, is upon us. It is planned to be held during the period June 12 to June 15. However, you are welcome to stay on Sunday June 16, for two Hierarchical Divine Liturgy in two days. If you have not registered for the PLC, please do so promptly by clicking the link here. In addition, Camp St. Thekla is also fast approaching and is planned for June 23-June 29 for session one and June 30-July 6 for session two. Furthermore, please be on the lookout for the Fall Retreat at the diocese website.

The Antiochian Women of DOMSE met in person and virtually on Saturday, April 20th, for our annual Hub and Spoke Lenten Retreat.

With an opening prayer and blessing from His Grace, Bishop Nicholas, our women began an in-depth discussion on the Seasons of Life and how to spend them in service to Christ and his Church. Our panel participants were Janet Yakubik, Christine Hallberg, and Stella Hallberg, who make up three generations of one Orthodox family, each of whom are faithfully serving the Church in different seasons. Janet spoke about growing up with two sets of grandparents who immigrated from Slovakia, and inheriting their traditions and love for service, and meeting her husband and raising three children in the Church. Christine spoke about finding herself in a time of transition where she has gone from having small children to now having teenagers who serve in the choir and altar instead of needing her during services. Stella is a junior in high school and spoke about looking forward to her next season in

life in college, and claiming her faith as her own by taking the initiative to attend Church and strengthen the OCF of whichever college she attends.

Our discussion compared each season in life to the seasons of the year, and how they affect the trees all around us. Stella might be said to be in spring, just beginning to bloom and show the fruit of her parents' labor in raising her in the Church. Christine in comparison sees herself as growing close to autumn, as her busy season of summer and actively shepherding her children through life comes to an end as they enter their teen years. Janet, as a loving grandmother, might be in

winter, and while trees in winter can look still, they are preparing for the rejuvenation of a new spring, and Janet feels that her season of stillness is an opportunity for prayer and to gracefully make

space for those taking on the hard work that characterized her autumn, summer, and spring.

Fr. Kamal Alrahil, the spiritual advisor of the Antiochian Women, closed the retreat in prayer and our ladies across the diocese turned off zoom and turned to each other to continue the discussion about their own seasons in life and to break bread together. We are so thankful to have had this morning to spend on this edifying reflection, and hope that each Antiochian Women's Group continues to celebrate all of the seasons of our DOMSE women.



DOMSE SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Applicant must be a current resident of one of the following states: Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, or Tennessee.
- Applicant must be a member in good standing, and regularly attend, a DOMSE parish.
- Applicant must have graduated from high school in the 2023-2024 academic year.
- Applicant must be accepted and enrolled as a freshman in the fall 2024 term at a college or university located in one of the states listed above.
- The award recipient(s) will receive an award of up to \$2,500.00 in scholarship funds. The award will be divided equally over two semesters, provided that the award recipient is enrolled and attends each such semester
- Each semester's award will be disbursed directly to the school prior to the beginning of such semester.
- The DOMSE Scholarship will be granted based on the Scholarship Committee's determination of an applicant's merit, and not based upon need. The Scholarship Committee's determination is final and not subject to review.
- In making its award decision, the Scholarship Committee will consider each applicant's high school grades, scholarship essay, parish involvement, academic involvement, pastoral recommendation, and other relevant factors.

Sacred Music Website

It is with great joy that I am able to share with you that we have a new Sacred Music Library! It has been completely overhauled to be very user-friendly. The result is a collaboration between the Departments of Sacred Music, Internet Ministry, Liturgics and Communications. This is an invaluable resource for our diocesan

church musicians.

Some Navigation Tips... Hover the arrow over the books, and it will describe what is in the link. Find the liturgical book you need, like Menaion for the fixed feast days of each month; or Octoechos for each of the tones for each of the days of the week; or Lenten Triodion or Pentecostarion for the seasons of Lent and Pascha, respectively. You can also navigate through liturgical services like the Divine Liturgy, Vespers, Orthros, Baptism, Funeral and more. The liturgical books are organized chronologically. Each piece of sheet music in PDF has detailed descriptions. Some even have matching MIDI or MP3 files, so singers can listen to learn new pieces.

So, sing to the Lord a new song, or at least get a clean copy of songs you have been singing for a while.

Finally, keep an eye out for our new Antiochian Online Sacred Music School. Exciting things are happening! May DOMSE's churches be filled with joyous singing.



Theology Editor's Corner


Christ is risen! Indeed, He is risen! St. Gregory the Theologian's Festal Orations are a treasure of the Church and invite us deeper into the mystery of many of the feasts that we celebrate each year. Indeed, St. John of Damascus even used "St. Gregory's orations as his primary source in composing the Paschal Canon" that we sing with joy during this season of brightness (*Festal Orations*, SVS Press, 13). St. Gregory says,

It is the day of resurrection and an auspicious beginning. Let us be made brilliant by the feast and embrace each other. Let us call brothers even those who hate us, and much more those who have done or suffered anything out of love for us. Let us concede all things to the resurrection. Let us grant pardon to each other... [57]

Yesterday I was crucified with Christ, today I am glorified with Him; yesterday I died with Him, today I am made alive with Him; yesterday I was buried with Him, today I rise with Him. But let us make an offering to the one who died and rose again for us. Perhaps you think I am speaking of gold or silver or tapestries or transparent precious stones, earthly matter that is in flux and remains below, of which the greater part always belongs to evil people and slaves of things below and of the ruler of this world. Let us offer our own selves, the possession most precious to God and closest to Him. Let us give back to the Image that which is according to the image, recognizing our value, honoring the Archetype, knowing the power of the mystery and for whom Christ died (58).

Let us become like Christ, since Christ also became like us; let us become gods because of Him, since He also because of us became human. He assumed what is worse that He might give what is better. He became poor that we through His poverty might become rich. He took the form of a slave, that we might regain freedom. He descended that we might be lifted up, He was tempted that we might be victorious, He was dishonored to glorify us, He died to save us, He ascended to draw to Himself us who lay below in the Fall of sin. Let us give everything, offer everything, to the one who gave Himself a ransom and an exchange for us. But one can give nothing comparable to oneself, understanding the mystery and becoming because of Him everything that He became because of us (59).

May each one of us become more like Christ during this holy season, that by dying with Him, we will be raised up! Christ is risen! Indeed, He is risen!
