



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CHRISTIAN EDUCATION



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CHRISTIAN EDUCATION



Prayer is the lifeblood of our relationship with God, and it is the central way that we can stay connected to Him from moment to moment. When we practice a prayer rule of morning and evening prayers, we dedicate our whole day to God and mentally prepare ourselves to be mindful of Him throughout the day and to talk to Him as often as we can. Here, St. Theophan the Recluse says, "just as someone standing in the sunshine is warm, so too is the person who always remembers God" (135). However, one of the greatest difficulties that we face when practicing a prayer rule is wandering thoughts, especially when we are reading prayers out of a prayer book. How can we make the most of our prayers and stay present as we offer them up to God?

St. Theophan the Recluse's book, *The Spiritual Life and How To Be Attuned* <u>To It</u>, is a kind of manual for prayer, and he offers the following guidance on wandering thoughts. He says,

For diminishing the straying of thought during prayer, it is necessary to make an effort to pray with warm feeling. To do this, it is necessary to warm the soul before prayer with meditation and bows [i.e. *metanias* or prostrations] [134]...

So that the words of the prayers in the prayerbook take on meaning and warm the heart, you should sit down in your free time... and think out thoroughly the content of the prayers, and become keenly aware of them. Then when you read the prayers during prayer-time, whether in the morning or evening, all those thoughts and feelings which came to you during meditation will be renewed, and they will collect your attention and warm your heart. Never read a prayer hurriedly. Another thing: Try to learn the prayers by heart. This greatly aids undistracted prayer. A prayer must be learned just like anything else (135)...

Just try each time to carry them out with full attention and corresponding feelings. To be more successful at this, spend a little of your free time at reading over all the prayers separately. Think them over and feel them, so that when you recite them at your prayer rule, you will know the holy thoughts and feelings that are contained in them. Prayer does not mean that we just recite prayers, but that we assimilate their content within ourselves, and pronounce them as if they came from our minds and hearts (191).

Ultimately, our thoughts wander when we only bring a part of ourselves to prayer, and St. Theophan is helpful in showing that we can only overcome this problem by making a concerted effort to bring more of ourselves to God in prayer - more of our mind, feelings, and even our body. Reflecting on the prayers beforehand helps us to understand them more fully and awakens the feelings that are associated with each of the phrases – even giving us a sense for how these feelings unfold as we pray. And bows – metanias and prostrations – allow us to engage our bodies and pray also with them. May we feel the bright warmth of God's divine light as we meditate on the words of our daily prayers and pray them with more of our mind, body, and heart!
